On the last occasion counsel for the appellant indicated that the transcript of recordings was almost complete, however the audio for one of the hearing dates was missing. The parties were encouraged to determine whether they can construct a transcript or notes of evidence from their personal notes pertaining to the hearing in question or whether the completed transcript is satisfactory for the purposes of the appeal. The Court recommended that the parties review counsel for the respondent's notes since he was counsel in the court below and seek to agree to use them while the Registrar seeks to obtain the judge's notes.
