- 2. The matter is adjourned to the next status hearing of the Court of Appeal for the State of Antigua and Barbuda scheduled for 23rd September 2024.**

Reason: The Court noted that the parties were not in possession of the Record of Appeal and the matter was adjourned to allow the Registrar of the High Court to serve it on them.
